

OBOU GBAIS



Obou Gbais was born in 1992 in Guiglo, Ivory Coast. After studying at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts d'Abidjan (INSAAC), he graduated in 2019 under the direction of the Artist Pascal Konan. His career is now successfully developing between West Africa and Europe, especially in France and Germany where he lives and works. A versatile artist, Obou also practices music; rap and hip-hop undoubtedly contributes to the urban and street art influence that can be found in his canvases and the many frescoes he paints on the walls of Abidjan.

The Dan mask is emblematic of the traditions of the west of the Ivory Coast where Obou is originally from. The artist paints this mask as well as he wears it. The faces with elongated chins and almond-shaped eyes, which he uses in crowd scenes or portraits, have become his trademark and his artistic identity. Obou also represents the bustle and vitality of Abidjan. In plain sight, on the facades of buildings or along roads, more discreet in the abandoned villas of Bassam, his touch is now familiar and omnipresent. Obou is the spokesperson for a young generation that is trying to reconcile two worlds: a connected and abundant urban life with

traditional rural foundations. Obou thus reaffirms his anchorage with his native land and mixes it with European cultural influences that he appropriates bridging two worlds whose confrontation reveals both powerful links and mutual ignorance.

LouiSimone Guirandou Gallery has been accompanying Obou since 2019 in various events: two group exhibitions in Abidjan - Density in 2019 and Carte Blanche in 2020, 1-54 Contemporary Arfrican Art Fair in New York (online) in 2021. The gallery will present his first solo show in Abidjan from September 22 to November 12, 2022.
